By the end of the module, students will be able to

- name and adopt rules of the diligence for drafting scientific papers and/or presentations,
- plan and work out self-reliant work steps for drafting an academic work and/or presentations,
- conduct literature researches, evaluate literature sources critically and adopt methods of quotations (also in presentations),
- use software for drafting project works and presentations (possibly with inclusive literature management),
- implement techniques of good scientific presentations,
- create group work expediently,
- adopt feedback rules
- reflect the own way of working.

Description/Contents:

The content of the project work result from the course contents of the selected optional compulsory courses and is determined by the lectures of the modules. The project work serves as preparation for the bachelor thesis. The Colloquiums amplify the knowledge in scientific

working techniques and methods, self and social competences. Thus it prepares for challenges in the future working practice.

Language:

The language of the module is German.

Teaching Methods:

Lectures, group work, presentations, self-study, students' presentations.

Module Applicability:

B.Sc. Economics.

Pre-requisites/Requirements:

Admission to study Economics for a Bachelor's degree.

Examination Types:

The topic supervisor determines the requirements of the exam in the form of another examination type (§ 6 (2), § 7 (2) of the examination regulations for the Bachelor's degree of Economics).

Requirements for Award of Credit Points:

Successful participation in the project work. The project work will be passed if the grade is at least "sufficient" (4,0). Classroom events can be compulsory by consideration of the module supervisor. Regulations of the assigned optional compulsory module have to be considered for the application.

Availability:

The module will be offered at least every second semester in the various optional compulsory courses. Generally it will be offered two project works during each semester.

Assessment:

This course will be graded and is part of the calculation for the overall grade of the Bachelor degree. Particular information concerning the calculation of the overall grade can be gathered in the respective examination regulations.

Person Responsible and Main Lecturer:

Person responsible and main lecturer of the elected optional compulsory module.

Further Information:

Signing in for a project work takes place in the student management and examination administration. Information concerning the organisation and planning can be asked at the chairs. References can be found in the module descriptions of the various optional compulsory modules. The project works (modules BQV03 and BQV04) have to be passed in two different optional compulsory modules.
