Intended Learning Outcomes (ILOs):

By the end of the module, students will be able to

- describe mechanisms of social target definition as they are used in the economic literature, demarcate and evaluate them critically;
- illustrate and interpret the microeconomic basic model of perfect markets;
- name and elucidate reasons for market failures;
- illustrate and analyse possibilities for economic political interventions;
- get to know microeconomic techniques for analysis of the treated subjects.

Through exercises and group works students will apply the gained knowledge from course 1 actively. Thus the capability to solve concrete issues in the field of economic political problems self-reliant, to analyse them and evaluate them, will be encouraged.

- 3. Collective Decisions and Main Features of the political Economy

Course 2: Economic Policy - tutorial

Changing focuses referring to the contents of course 1.

Language:

The language of the module is German.

Teaching Methods:

Lecture, tutorial, group work, self-study.

Module Applicability:

B.Sc. Economics; B.Sc. Mathematics.

Pre-requisites/Requirements:

Admission to study Economics or Mathematics for a Bachelor's degree. It is recommended that participants attended the module BV04 already, because fundamental methods and techniques of the Economics are worked out during the module.

Examination Types:

Comprehensive examination in the form of a written exam at the end of each semester (120 minutes).

Successful participation in the exam. The exam will be passed if the grade is at least "sufficient" (4,0).
