Organizational Issues

Module Structure

Modules consist of several courses, allowing exchange students to flexibly design their studies. A typical module includes lectures, tutorials, and seminars. Students may complete full modules, select individual courses from a module, or register for parts of a course to meet their home university's requirements. Examinations

Each course or module includes a specific form of assessment, such as a written exam, presentation, or other course-related requirement. By selecting from different courses and modules, exchange students can choose assessment formats that suit their preferences. In many cases, students may also complete a term paper as an alternative or additional form of assessment.

Coordination

Exchange students are welcomed with an orientation session at the beginning of the semester. Central coordination and weekly office hours ensure clear communication and continuous support from a single point of contact.
